### **CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS**

#### **A. Show and Exhibition Rules.**

1. The Society shall hold a Show Annually on such day or days as the Board of Management shall determine.
2. The Board shall have absolute discretion as to the Classes of Exhibits, the persons eligible to compete in any class, the PRIZE MONEY to be offered, the level of Entry Fees, the conditions of entry and exhibition, and all other matters connected with the Show.
3. The Board of Management shall approve the Schedule of Prize Money for each year and send a copy to all exhibitors who entered in the previous year; otherwise schedules will only be supplied on request and upon receipt of a C5 92 pence SAE.
4. Animals which are subject to restrictions under the Animal Health Act 1981 (as amended) or the Animal and Animal products (Import and Export) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (as amended) will not be allowed onto the Showground.

5. Every Exhibitor or Competitor is requested to examine carefully the list of PRIZE MONEY: and Conditions, as he/she will be held responsible for the correctness of his/her entry form. An Exhibitor's entry may be disqualified should they have failed to give any of the information asked for on an entry form. The Competitors award may be cancelled if they fail to prove the accuracy of the details on the Entry Form. If an Exhibitor desires his animal to compete for any special prize offered, he must notify this on the entry form where requested to do so.
6. Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry. In the event of the death of an Exhibitor between the date of entry and the date of the Show, the executors of the deceased will be deemed to be the Exhibitor.
7. The term Exhibitor will include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Society, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground.
8. Entries from persons under 18 years of age may be accepted only provided the entry forms are countersigned by the parent, guardian or trustee of the entrant, who shall be held responsible for the correctness of the entry, and for compliance with the regulations of the show. Any entry made in contravention of this regulation and inadvertently accepted may be cancelled
9. Exhibitors are not permitted to enter any animals in any class, which is to be judged by a person who has or has had a financial interest in the animal. The onus of complying with this regulation rests entirely on the Exhibitor.
10. Substitution of Judges - the Society reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those named in the Schedule or make additional appointments. Where time permits Exhibitors will be informed of the change or via the website [www.berkshireshow.co.uk](http://www.berkshireshow.co.uk)
11. Cancellation of classes -The Board reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any classes which in their opinion are insufficiently filled.

## **B. Exhibitor's risk and responsibility**

1. Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANY WAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants, or agents, or to any exhibit, or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any crate, package, show-case or other article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit, or any other property brought into the Showground or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to, the Society's Show.
2. EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or rising from any animal or article exhibited by said persons, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Each exhibitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Society for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals.
3. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants or agents. Any fine imposed upon an exhibitor, or a person employed by him, for infringing the regulations or disobedience to the order of the Stewards, shall be recoverable from the exhibitor as a debt due to the Society and, until such payment, shall debar such exhibitor from exhibiting at any future show of the Society.
4. Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers.
5. Exclusion and Limitation of Liability and Indemnity

(a) The Society shall not be responsible to any Entrant for any form of economic loss whether direct or indirect and howsoever caused.

(b) The Society shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever while upon the Society's Showground for any form of economic loss whether direct or indirect and howsoever caused.

(c) All Entrants shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expense and claim made against the Society on account of or in respect of the negligence or breach of contract of the Entrant.

(d) The Board requires all Entrants and Exhibitors to insure themselves and their exhibits against all liabilities both to the Society and to all other persons using the Society's Showground unless the Secretary gives written dispensation.

6. The right is reserved to require an appropriate certificate of insurance to be produced for inspection by the Society on demand.

### **C. Entries/fees**

1. Entries for competitions shall be made on the official form and sent to the Show Manager by the dates as printed in the schedule. Forms are available to download from [www.berkshireshow.co.uk](http://www.berkshireshow.co.uk)
2. If any animal is entered in more than one class this must be clearly stated on the entry form.
3. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the appropriate fee; and, where the exhibitor is a member of the Society, the subscription for the year, unless previously paid. A charge of £25 will be made for returned or refused cheques.
4. In the absence of any special condition to the contrary the following conditions shall apply, namely, that the class shall be deemed to be open to All. The Board reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason.
5. Entry fees will only be refunded in the event of cancellation of Classes, or a Ministry order prohibiting the exhibition of animals at the Show. They will not be refunded if the Show has to be cancelled for any reason beyond the control of the Society.
6. The Society in its absolute discretion may refuse any entry or cancel any entry already accepted, or the Show Chairman may decline at any stage to admit any proposed exhibit, or order the removal of or remove, at the expense and risk of the exhibitor, any exhibit already delivered. Whenever under this regulation an entry is refused or cancelled, or any exhibit is refused admission or removed, the fees paid for such entry may, at the discretion of the Society, be refunded, and, if refunded, shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society.
7. An Entrant shall mean any person who enters any competition or class or exhibits any item of any description during the show. The privilege of entering at Members' rates is strictly limited to members of the Newbury and District Agricultural Society. No member, while his subscription is unpaid, shall enjoy any privileges of this Society, and no person, formerly a member of the Society but resigning whilst standing indebted to the Society, shall be permitted to make entries for the Show.
8. If an Exhibitor or Competitor fails, when called upon by the Stewards or Board, to prove the correctness of his Entry Form to their satisfaction, the Entry may be disqualified and any award made to it cancelled.
9. Any entrant or his servant refusing to obey an order from the Stewards shall not be allowed to compete.
10. The local area of the Society shall extend to a distance of 25 miles radius from the Corn Exchange, Newbury
11. No refunds of entry fees or stall or penning fees will be made if the Show has to be cancelled for any reason beyond the control of the Society.
12. Any Exhibitor withdrawing an exhibit after the closing date of entries will not be entitled to have entry fees, penning or stall fees refunded,

## D. General Rules

1. **Dress** - All stock attendants must be turned out to an acceptable standard. Stock attendants in charge of sheep, goats and pigs **MUST WEAR WHITE COATS** when leading animals in the ring during judging and parades. Stock attendants in charge of cattle must wear white coats or breed society uniform and footwear capable of being disinfected whilst in the animal area. Smoking by persons in charge of stock during judging or on parade is strictly prohibited.

### Catalogue Listings

All livestock will be listed in the catalogue under the name of the exhibitor.

It must state on the entry form if the owner is not the exhibitor and wishes to be named in the catalogue.

1. **Admission passes** – Admission passes will be allocated as follows;

**Cattle, Pigs, Goats:** Up to 2 animals entered = 2 tickets, 3 animals entered = 3 tickets, 4/5/6 animals = 4 tickets, 7/8/9 animals entered = 6 tickets, 10 animals = 7 tickets.

**Pigs:** 1 - 3 animals entered=2 tickets, 4 - 6 animals entered = 3 tickets, 7+ animals entered = 4 tickets

Additional tickets may be purchased at the Advanced Rate of £14 with your entry.

### Prizes/Trophies – see respective classes for value of prizes offered

2. **Withholding prizes** – A judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.
3. **Championship Prizes**- First and Second prize winners must, where eligible, compete for the championship prizes, or they will be liable to the forfeiture of their class prizes.
4. **Forfeiture of prizes** – The Show Chairman, on the report of a steward, shall have power, on the infringement of any of these or other prescribed regulations or conditions, to subject the exhibitor to a fine of £25 and to the forfeiture of any prize to which he/she may be entitled (in addition to all other consequences attaching to such infringement)
5. **Prize money** – will be calculated on the number of entries forward on the day
6. **Dispatch of prize money** – Cheques for the prizes awarded at the show will be sent by post to the exhibitors concerned after the Show. Any outstanding accounts due to the Society will be off-set against any prize money or other amount owed to the exhibitor.

PRIZEWINNERS MUST PRESENT THEIR CHEQUES BY 1<sup>st</sup> APRIL 2012 AFTER WHICH DATE PAYMENT WILL BE STOPPED AND THE PRIZE MONEY FORFEITED.

7. All exhibits and all persons in charge of the same will be subject to the Orders, Regulations and Rules of the Society and the Stewards shall have the power to remove from the Showground the Stock or property belonging to, and to cancel the admission ticket of, any Exhibitor who shall infringe any of the Regulations or Conditions of the Show, or who shall refuse to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards, without any responsibility attaching to the Stewards of the Society in consequence of such removal.
8. No Steward will be allowed to show his/her own animal before the Judge; neither shall he/she be allowed in the Judging Ring whilst the Class in which he/she has an exhibit is being judged.
9. The handler of any animal will be asked to remove it from the ring if, in the opinion of the Steward, he/she is unable to control the animal safely. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament should not be brought to the Showground. When in the opinion of the Society's Officers, Senior Stewards, the Police, the Health and Safety Executive or other competent authority, an animal's behaviour poses an immediate threat to life and limb of people in its immediate vicinity, the Society reserves the right to mitigate such

threat in such manner as they see fit, without any obligation to make good any loss or damage suffered as consequence of enacting this regulation.

10. No person will be allowed to fix any placard, or to take down any placard in the Showground, without permission of the Stewards. No trading, from cars or vans, in the Lorry Park will be permitted.
11. No objections shall be made or taken to any award or decision of the Judges except on the ground that the same is not in accordance with the conditions governing the Class or Entry in respect of which it was given or made. Any objection authorized by this rule and any matters not provided for by these Rules or the General Rules of the Society shall be referred to the Board, whose decision shall be final. Any person lodging an objection shall at the same time deposit the sum of £10 with the Secretary, which shall be forfeited if, in the opinion of the Board, such objection shall be considered frivolous. All objections must be made in writing and must be received by the Secretary on the day of the Show.
12. All prize-winning animals in the Cattle Section must parade in the Arena on both days of the Show, and all prize-winning animals in the Pedigree Sheep Classes must parade in the Arena on the first day of the Show.

**Failure to do so will result in PRIZE MONEY being forfeited.**

13. No stock attendants shall be allowed to lead more than one animal at a time in the Judging Ring or Main Arena. They must be fully equipped to handle the exhibit; any animal found to be loose on the Showground is liable to a £25 on the spot fine from the stewards.
14. **Photographic Rights** - Competitors and Exhibitors give permission for any photographic and/or film or TV footage taken of persons or livestock taking part in Newbury and District Agricultural Society events to be used and published in any media whatsoever for editorial purposes, press information or advertising by or on behalf of Newbury and District Agricultural Society and/or official sponsors of Newbury and District Agricultural Society.
15. The Society reserves the right to publish through any media the entrants and winners names and addresses supplied on the Entry Form.
16. As an entrant we will store the data you provide us with on computer and we will use said data for marketing, statistical and analytical purposes. You will receive communications and from time to time we will let you know about our work and promotions.
17. THE ADMISSION OF DOGS INTO THE SHOWGROUND IS PROHIBITED (except in the case of Guide Dogs for the Blind which must have the appropriate pass attached to the collar). Anyone contravening this Regulation may be asked to leave the Showground.
18. **Welfare of animals** – The legislation which came into force in January 2007 brings in new rules covering the movement of animals. If you move livestock as part of your business then you will be affected. Under the new rules everyone transporting animals commercially must comply. Please see [www.defra.gov.uk](http://www.defra.gov.uk) for further details.

**Veterinary inspection**

19. The Veterinary Inspectors of the Society will carry out spot checks of livestock throughout the Show. Those animals originating directly from another Member State will be checked as required by the provision of Chapter II of the Council Directive 90/425/EEC. All health documentation must be presented and the animals adequately identifiable.
20. The Society's Inspectors or those appointed by DEFRA are authorised to exclude or place in isolation any animals which, in their opinion, are exhibiting any symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any other condition which they consider warrants its exclusion or whose identity cannot be adequately established. In such an event a certificate recording the findings of the Inspector shall be handed to the person in charge of the rejected animal. Each exhibitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Society for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or

any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring in the event of the area from which entries are to be conveyed to the Show being declared a Movement Prohibited Area that such entries are not sent for exhibition.

21. Veterinary treatment of animals whilst at the Show. Antibiotics, inhibitory substances, and other prescription only medicines are banned at the Showground unless they are administered under the supervision of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons.
22. Veterinary emergency treatment. It is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Officers may on their own authority, give to any animal such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his/her representative cannot immediately be found.
23. Veterinary charges. Exhibitors will be required to re-imburse the Society for the full cost of treatment, services and certification administered by the Society's Veterinary Officers attending animals. Accounts will be rendered after the Show.
24. The Society vet will have the right to treat an animal if urgent attention is required and the owner cannot be found.
25. Any owner of an animal, which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the Showground is liable to compensate the Society for all expenses incurred in connection with any claims resulting from such diseases. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorized to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to, or to have to be removed from, the Showground, any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease or with disease, which, in their opinion, was likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Concealment of any disease will render the exhibitor liable to disqualification.
26. The Certificate of the Chief Veterinary Officer, whether as to age or soundness, shall be required only in cases where the judges are in doubt, or where the Stewards may consider it necessary. The decision of the Chief Veterinary Officer in such cases shall be final and conclusive; and in case it shall be against the animal to which a prize has been awarded, such animals shall be disqualified from receiving such prize.
27. During the time the Show is open to the public, no rug or cloth shall be hung up so as to conceal any animal in a pen or stall, except in the case of unfit animals and then only on the production of a certificate signed by the Society's Chief Veterinary Officer. All sheets used for this purpose must be removed before the opening of the Show each morning and must not be replaced until 7.00 pm each day.
28. The Society reserves the right to test any livestock exhibits for the presence of hormones or illegal substances, which may affect the behaviour, or performance of the animal in the ring. Refusal to submit a sample will be dealt with by the Society at their discretion.

## **Health & Safety**

29. **Health and Safety Regulations at Agricultural Shows** - In accordance with the Health & Safety legislation all livestock exhibitors/stock attendants must now comply with the above.
30. In the case of led cattle/sheep/pigs/goats it is imperative that exhibitors/stockpersons are aware of their obligations to the safety of the general public at all times whilst on the Showground and observe orders from Officials or Stewards in respect of crossing points etc.
31. Livestock exhibitors are reminded that the show environment can be upsetting for livestock, even those of normally placid temperament. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament must not be brought to the showground. When in the opinion of the Society's Officers, the Police, the Health & Safety Executive or other competent authority an animal's behaviour poses an immediate threat to life and limb of people in its immediate vicinity the Society reserves the right to instruct an authorized person to mitigate such threat in such manner as shall to that authorized person seem appropriate, not excluding the humane destruction of the said animal. By exhibiting at the Royal County of Berkshire Show exhibitors are deemed to authorize such person or persons to so act. Exhibitors by exhibiting at the Royal County of Berkshire Show acknowledge and agree that the Society, its employees, servants and agents shall not be liable for any such matters as are referred to in this Regulation and in particular but not by way of

limitation that the Society shall not be liable for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect or consequential) suffered as a consequence of the Society instructing such person or persons as are referred to above. Further, each exhibitor by exhibiting at the Royal County of Berkshire Show hereby indemnifies and agrees to indemnify the Society, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liability, claims and costs which result there from.

32. All "live in" vehicles (horseboxes, wagons, caravans) must be parked at least 5 metres apart. Please follow the instructions of a parking attendant. Please indicate on your entry form the number of people staying on site over night.
33. **Children on the Showground.** Please be aware that during the build-up of the Royal County of Berkshire Show, the Showground is a working site and can be a dangerous environment for children. Please ensure you are aware of where your children are and that you keep them under close observation at all times.
34. **Electrical Appliances** - All electrical appliances that are intended to be used within the Livestock Lines must have a current Safety Test Certificate and have verification of such inspection. The Society reserves the right to confiscate and return after the Show any equipment considered to be non compliant. Nominated officials will carry out safety inspections of electrical cables and equipment. The Society's nominated electrical contractor will, at a cost to the exhibitor, carry out appliance testing on site for exhibitors with non compliant equipment.

**PERSONAL ELECTRICITY GENERATORS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED.**

35. **Electrical Supply Cables** - In the interests of safety cables must not, in any circumstances, be trailed across doorways or gangways.
36. No oil or cooking stove of any description may be lit in the Stock Lines.

**Biosecurity at the Royal County of Berkshire Show - Animal Gatherings Order 2004**

**DEFRA REGULATIONS AT TIME OF PRINTING.**

37. The Royal County of Berkshire Show is to be licensed by DEFRA and has a biosecurity officer whose job is to make sure that the rules are followed.
38. Exhibitors must follow the instructions given to them by the show organisers and the biosecurity officer. In particular, before leaving the animal area, exhibitors must cleanse and disinfect their footwear if it is contaminated with animal excreta and safely dispose of disposable clothing or change any contaminated clothing. Prior to leaving their stock, exhibitors must also clear all bedding, used feed or animal excreta from the walkway beside their animals, dispose of this in the correct manner and clean and disinfect any equipment prior to removal from the animal area.

**Admission of Livestock**

**Please DO NOT use Satnavs to find your way to the showground. It takes no account of our traffic management plan and you will be directed to the wrong place .**

**The Livestock Gate will be open from 1700 – 1900 on Thursday, 0800- 2000 on the Friday and from 0700 on the Saturday and Sunday. To comply with the Show requirements animals arriving outside of these hours will not be admitted to the site. All cattle MUST be on the showground by 2000 or Friday 16<sup>th</sup>. September**

**Departure of Livestock**

**Cattle, Sheep, Pigs and Goats: Livestock vehicles may not enter the Showground before 15.30 hours for the loading of livestock. Under no circumstances are exhibitors allowed to walk their livestock out of the Showground for loading.**

**Exhibitors who do not comply with the above regulation will forfeit their prize money.**

**COMPETITORS NOT COMPLYING WITH THIS RULE WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

No vehicle will be allowed to remain in or near Cattle Lines or Sheep Pens, after 8 am on the first day of the Show.

**SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED IN ANY OF THE TENTS FOR SAFETY REASONS**

### **NOTES TO CATTLE EXHIBITORS**

RULES AND REGULATIONS MUST BE ADHERED TO The original documentation, Chequebook Style Passport (CPP13) OR Certificate of registration (CHR3) OR (CPP1) MUST accompany the cattle to the Show for inspection. They will be required when collecting numbers from the commentary box. All cattle born after July 1st, 1999 must be accompanied by a CPP certificate. The herd scheme registration number and status must be shown on the entry form.

1. On arrival at the showground, all exhibitors must report to the steward BEFORE unloading. Animals should be double tied before leaving them (i.e. A serviceable halter and neck restraint used)
2. Whilst the Society will take all necessary precautions to protect the status of cattle in the Cattle Health Scheme, it will not hold itself responsible for any accidental contacts made which may affect the status of any exhibitor's herd.
3. Exhibitors are expected to comply with the standard of dress recommended by their respective Breed Societies.

### **BRUCELLOSIS CONTROLS**

4. Should the herd lose its Accredited status between the closing date of entries and the date of the Show, entry fees paid will be refunded provided application, accompanied by appropriate Ministry document(s), is made to the Secretary.
5. Cows or Heifers which calve at full term at the show will be placed in isolation to be returned to the premises of origin as soon as possible. Cows or Heifers showing abnormal discharge or which appear about to abort or calve prematurely, will be placed in isolation and must be returned to the premises of origin immediately together with all other show animals from the same premises.
6. Cattle must not be brought to the Show if at the time of the Show
  - (a) The herd is subject to a notice from the Department of Environment, Food & Rural Affairs prohibiting movement off or onto the farm without a licence, or
  - (b) The individual animal entered for the Show is subject to the detention notice served by the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs or a temporary restrictive notice.

In the event of cattle entered not being able to be exhibited for either of the above reasons, the entry fees paid for the animals concerned will be refunded on production of the notice served by the Ministry prohibiting the movements.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

7. Tented accommodation will be provided for cattle.
8. Only animals entered in the following classes are eligible to compete for the Cups, Medals and Special Prizes.
9. If required, Dairy Cattle will be milked out under the Supervision of the Cattle Stewards. Milking Facilities will be provided but Exhibitors are requested to bring their own milking bucket and cluster.

### ALL EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

10. The Show reserves the right to treat sick animals at their discretion - even in the absence of their owner.
11. All livestock must have a responsible person in charge **AT ALL TIMES**.
12. Please be aware of the current TB testing regime.

Please note that all vehicles depositing cattle and departing on the same day must be washed before leaving the Showground. Washing facilities are provided.

(a) "The Goat classes / Milking Competitions are held under the Rules, Regulations and Recognition of the British Goat Society. All exhibits must be registered with the BGS as in the ownership and in the name of the exhibitor, the registered name and number being quoted on the entry form. (Also the kidding date for goats in milk) All goats in milk must be kidded or aborted a minimum of 30 days previous to the date of the Show".

(b) " The British Goat Society" offers:

1. A ROSETTE for the best Goat in the Show.
2. A CHALLENGE CERTIFICATE for the Best Goat that has borne a kid.
3. A CHALLENGE CERTIFICATE for the best Inspection/Production Goat.

#### LOCAL REGULATIONS

1. NO PREGNANT GOATS SHALL BE ADMITTED TO THE SHOWGROUND.
2. Exhibitors are requested not to bring to the Showground any goats that have ever had a positive reaction to a CAE test, and are advised that milk produced at Shows should not be fed to goats of any age as this appears to have been a factor in the spread of infection.
3. In order to separate SAC CAE Accredited herds from CAE tested herds and BGS Monitored herds. Accredited herds must enclose their appropriate certificate. CAE certificates must accompany entry forms and be current at the date of the Show. Facilities will be provided for SAC CAE Accredited herds, MAFF herd number to be put on the entry form, and the SAC Certificate of Status must accompany goats to the Show.
4. All dairy goats, NOT to arrive on the Showground before 1230 on Friday 16th September 2011 , but MUST be here by 1700 on the same day. Milkers to be stripped out by 1800 on Friday 16th September 2011.
5. 6 ft. square pens will be provided and you are responsible for restraining your stock within these pens.
6. No entire male goats may be brought on the Showground.
7. Milking competition will be judged on the 24 hrs. ending 1800 on Saturday 17th September 2011
8. All Dairy goats must stay on the Showground until 1800 on Sunday, 18th September 2011
9. No human or goat clobber to be left in the aisles for safety reasons.
10. Pen Allocation - Exhibitors are requested not to move pens without first consulting with the Chief Steward.

### NOTES TO PIG EXHIBITORS

Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment, including bats and boards, is provided for use by animal handlers.

BPA rosettes will be awarded only to members of the British Pig Association

### ENTRY AND EXIT TIMES

1. No pigs may leave the showground on Saturday until after 3.30pm No pigs may leave the Showground on Sunday until after 3.30pm The Pigs (Records, Identification & Movement) Order 1995: All pigs coming to the Show must be accompanied by a Schedule 3 Declaration, completed by the owner. Pigs left overnight must be fed by 8.30 a.m. PLEASE NOTE: All pigs must be on the Showground by 0800 and Exhibitors are requested to keep their pigs on the Showground for both days if possible.

### EAR MARKING /BPA Registration

2.Pigs to have been registered in a published volume or accepted for entry in a forthcoming volume of the British Pig Association's Herd Book.(It is not sufficient for an animal to be 'eligible for registration'). Animals registered in a Grading Register of a Herd Book are not eligible for entry in Agricultural Show classes.

The ear number, registered name, Herd Book number and date of birth of each pig, also the name and Herd Book number of sire and dam must be supplied for printing in the catalogue together with the name and breeder in cases where the exhibitor is not also the breeder.

Pigs should be ear-marked in accordance with the rules of their respective breed societies and in accordance with National legislation, and ear numbers must be stated on the entry form for inclusion in the catalogue. The ear numbers will be checked at the Show to make sure that they correspond with the numbers in the catalogue.

### FEMALE PIGS

3. At all Shows in 2011 , female pigs (all breeds) born before 1st January 2010 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show or on or after 1st January 2011 they have farrowed, suckled and reared to three weeks of age, a litter of pigs.

4. Female pigs born on or after 1st January 2010 and before 1st July 2010 (BERKSHIRE, GLOUCESTERSHIRE OLD SPOTS, HAMPSHIRE, LANDRACE, LARGE WHITE and MIDDLE WHITE breeds ONLY), shall have either produced and reared a litter of pigs within six months prior to the show or produced a LIVE litter within twelve weeks of the first day of the Show. Female pigs of the BRITISH SADDLEBACK, DUROC and LARGE BLACK breeds born on or after 1st January 2010 and before 1st March 2010 shall have farrowed and suckled a litter of pigs prior to the Show. Females born on or after 1st March and before 1st July 2010 shall farrow within twelve weeks of the first day of the Show. Female pigs of the TAMWORTH breed only born on or after 1st January 2010 and before 1st July 2010 shall either have farrowed, suckled and reared a litter prior to the Show or produce a live litter within six weeks of July 1st 2011. Female pigs of the WELSH breed born on or after 1st January 2010 and before 1st March 2010 shall have farrowed and suckled a litter of pigs prior to the Show. Females born on or after 1st March and before 1st July 2010, shall farrow before, or within eight weeks after the first day of the Show.

### BOARS

5. Boars of two years of age and over (all breeds) are to be certified as having sired at least three live litters within the twelve months preceding the date on which entries for the Show close. The pigs

comprising such litters are to have been litter notified in the British Pig Association's Herd Book or proof of their birth must have been given to the Association.

6. Boars aged twelve months or more at the time of exhibition must have their tusks cut prior to the Show.

7. All boars must be shown by two competent adult handlers who are equipped with protective boards.

### **FAKING**

8. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots on pigs by artificial means is prohibited (white woodflour is permitted).

### **JUNIOR HANDLERS**

9. Junior handlers will be allowed to show Females only. An adult handler of the pig must accompany the junior handler to and from the pig housing and remain by the ringside during judging and presentations. When showing in mixed classes and all Inter-breed competitions the adult handler must remain in the ring with the junior handler during judging and presentations. The onus is on the owners/exhibitors or guardians to ensure the safety of the junior handlers at all times.

### **RECORDS, IDENTIFICATION AND MOVEMENT OF PIGS TO AND FROM SHOWS**

10. Exhibitors must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show. All pigs from Scotland must be accompanied by a Schedule 3 declaration under Article 9 of The Pigs (Records, Identification and Movement) Order 1995 or an equivalent declaration from an EU Member State in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive in force at the time, including additional certification of freedom from Aujeszky's disease. Pigs from Northern Ireland should be accompanied by certification provided by the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, including additional certification of freedom from Aujeszky's disease. Any pigs that are sold or otherwise disposed of or are not returning to the premises of origin must be licensed from the show under a Schedule 7 licence issued by a Diseases of Animals Inspector of the Warwickshire County Council, who can be contacted via the Pig Steward. If pigs are to travel direct to another EU Member State, certification in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive in force at the time, must be obtained from the Divisional Veterinary Manager.

### **PDNS/PWMS**

11. The NDAS require a declaration from the owner on a health documentation form issued by the Society to be completed within 48 hours of departure of the pigs (listed on the entry form) to the Showground, confirming that PDNS or PWMS has not been diagnosed on the premises in the previous 6 months and that there have been no unusual numbers of abortions or premature farrowings in sows or gilts or deaths and weaknesses in young piglets, not attributable to known diseases within the previous 8 weeks. This declaration must accompany pigs to the Showground and must be handed to the Official Veterinary Surgeon.

## NOTES TO SHEEP EXHIBITORS

SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE SHEEP TENTS FOR SAFETY REASONS

**Please Note** The Newbury & District Agricultural Society is not a central point recording centre (CPRC). You will therefore be required to list all the individual TAG numbers of the entries attending the show on your movement licence.

Every animal entered in Classes 701-740 must be entered in, or certified as eligible, or accepted for entry in the Flock Book of its breed. Where the animal is entered by the exhibitor as eligible or accepted for entry in the Flock Book, proof of such eligibility or acceptance must be furnished to the Secretary, if required. Exhibitors are requested not to use bloom dip or bloom powder on exhibits. Judges will be asked to deduct marks/points from animals so treated.

**DOCKING:** You are reminded that The Welfare of Livestock (Prohibition Operations) Reg. 1982 requires that sheep must have sufficient tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of male sheep. In the event of a formal complaint being received for infringement of this requirement the matter will be referred to the Society vet.

## MAEDI VISNA ACCREDITED FLOCKS SCHEME

(a) The Society will accept entries from either full MV Accredited sheep or from non-accredited sheep, according to breed (q.v.)

(b) Separate accommodation will be provided and identified for both categories.

(c) Separate Unloading /Loading points will be provided.

(d) All sheep must be halter /collar lead and will be judged together.

(e) MV Accredited sheep must be accompanied by a valid S.A.C. Certificate of status stating the number and the classification of their Scheme Status including, in the case of an Accredited Flock, the flock registration number. Certificates will be handed to the steward in charge before sheep are allowed into the pens provided for them. THE FLOCKS SCHEME STATUS MUST ALSO BE SHOWN ON THE ENTRY FORM and a photocopy of the S.A.C. certificate enclosed.

(f) Exhibitors (flock owners) are responsible for the following :- Avoidance of any contact with sheep of a lower category (or Goats). If no contact has been made, sheep may return home without any isolation subject to a blood test 6-9 months later. If contact has been made then the sheep must be placed in isolation on return and undergo appropriate blood tests to regain their scheme status.

(g) Whilst the Society will take all necessary precautions to protect the status of scheme sheep it will not hold itself responsible for any accidental contacts made which may affect the status of any exhibitors flock.

**SCRAPIE- MONITORED FLOCKS.** Please note that separate accommodation will be provided for Sheep from Scrapie-Monitored flocks in the Hampshire Down, Suffolk and Texel classes, if the Society is notified of the herd status on the entry form. Newbury & District Agricultural Society take no responsibility whatsoever in the event of monitored sheep coming into contact with non-monitored stock. Failure of prize winners to participate in the parade of Livestock may result in forfeiture of prize money.

Entries for Fleece, Craft & Spun Fibre Classes close: August 27th 2011

All entries to be made from yarn using fleece from a breed eligible for the show, either alone or combined with other fibres such as silk, mohair or fleece from another breed. These may be plied, blended, or combined with other handspun yarn, but the whole to consist of not less than 50% Rare or Minority or Traditional Breed Wool.

#### **Class 812**

##### **Natural coloured hand spun garment**

Natural coloured hand spun and hand made using natural fibres from a breed of animal eligible for the show, sheep, goat, alpaca etc. Garment must be labelled with details of the fibres used.

#### **Class 813**

##### **Garment at least 50% wool , commercially spun yarn**

Hand spun or commercial wool which must contain at least 50% natural fibres. Garment must be labelled with details of the fibres used.

#### **Class 814**

##### **All wool skein 100% any animal fleece, natural coloured, plied**

A plied skein of any animal eligible for the show, must be labelled with the breed of the animal.

#### **Class 815**

##### **Fancy Skein, hand spun from any natural fibre**

Any skein not eligible for the above class, fancy, dyed unusual fibres etc. Must be clearly labelled with the fibres used.

#### **Class 816**

##### **Open Craft Class for any item made from wool or natural fibre**

Item must be labelled with the fibre used and construction techniques, felt, weaving, knitting etc.
